The current Family Violence Help Cards will be phased out over the next 12 months.

Help Cards will now be distributed free of charge.

An alternative to the help cards is the multi-language poster for women. A multi-language men's poster will also be available from late April 2017.

A number of organisations have changed their phone numbers. In normal circumstances we would review and reprint the cards, however as intake into the family violence service system will change significantly with the introduction of Support and Safety Hubs, this is not a viable approach. The Aboriginal women's and men's cards remain up-to-date.

As the help cards are phased out some cards will become unavailable.
