



Inclusion - Assessment

- Referring worker supporting Rita and Tommy would call Bright Futures
- If referral is appropriate Handover arranged with referring worker
- Including child in assessment (interests, strengths, hopes and dreams)
- Co-case management







Feelings and Emotions








Predictability and Consistency Continuity of Care


